Residents Accepted:

Men over the age of 18 on any type of parole.
Each application is considered individually

Exclusions:

- An offender who has not taken part in recommended programming (time in the institution is taken into consideration) may be excluded.
- Where the offender's risk to re-offend is considered to be too high for the safety of the community.
- When the offender's behavior in the institution has been very problematic.

History:

The Salvation Army has a very long history of working with CSC to help reintegrate offenders into the community.

Short Description:

We operate a 21-bed CRF with 13 private rooms for men only over 18. We do not exclude anyone based on type of offence or parole (Residency condition is not a problem).

Acceptance Procedure:

Offenders apply through their IPO to the local Parole Office; the local Parole Office contacts us requesting a Community Assessment and decision as to whether or not we will accept the offender at our CRF. We screen the applicant and decide whether we will accept, defer acceptance (accept with certain conditions such as proving positive behavior in the community at a CCC for a set period of time) or deny service based on the offender's performance in the institution (behavior) and whether or not they have taken part in the recommended programming and their risk to re-offend.

Description:

The New Frontiers CRF is located just two blocks from the downtown core. A 15-minute walk to the Parole Office and the EI office. There is bus service one block from the Centre. Clients are able to park vehicles in our monitored parking lot through the night and plug them in during the winter months. All rooms are equipped with full cable service. Meals and laundry facilities are provided at no cost to our clients. Clients are not required to attend the chapel services.

Programs:

- We do not offer any formal programming but do work closely with the PO's to meet the identified needs of the offenders residing at our Centre.
- We offer one to one programming for a wide range of identified needs such as Chemical Dependency, 12-Step Recovery, Grief, Life Management, Budgeting, Relapse Prevention Planning, Gambling and Community Outings.

Institutions the Residence Visits:

- Sask. Penitentiary, RBI and RPC are the three main institutions visited.
- However, trips are made yearly to Drumheller, Bowden, Edmonton, Grand Cache, Stony Mountain and Rockwood Institutions to provide updated information to the CMT's and IPO's at each Institution.
- Visits with offenders requesting information can be arranged at those Institutions during that time because of distance constraints.
- Communications from IPO's and CMT's via the above e-mail address or by the provided phone number are welcomed and encouraged.
